by artist friends, Roger began showing his work in late 2006. Since then, he has received a significant number of awards in juried shows. Seeing how dwarfed photographs tend to look among multi-media show entries, he has worked at developing ways of producing larger-size images of suitable resolution and quality to compete visually. Influenced by his artist wife, Margaret Hamilton, Roger has also become interested in pastel painting, which has been well received and awarded as well.
